



## General rules for abstract submission to EUROMIT 2026

### 1. Eligibility

- The **presenting author** must be registered for the congress and available to attend.
- Each individual may only submit **1 abstract as the main author but may be mentioned as co-author in another one.**
- Abstracts presented by young researchers or students (maximum 5 years after PhD) are also eligible for an oral presentation at the Young Investigators' Day.

---

### 2. Abstract content requirements

Abstracts should include:

- **Title:** Concise, descriptive, without abbreviations or brand names.
- **Authors & affiliations:** List ALL authors with correct institutional affiliations.
- **Structured body:**
  - **Background/objectives**
  - **Methods**
  - **Results**
  - **Conclusions**

---

### 3. Formatting & style

- **Length:** limited to **250 words** (excluding title and author info).
- **Language:** abstracts must be submitted in **English**.
- **Abbreviations:** use only standard abbreviations; define them at first mention.
- **No figures or tables.**

---

### 4. Submission process & deadlines

- Submit via the **online submission portal only, not abstract by email will be allowed.**
- Ensure submission by the **deadline** March 15th 2026



- You may be able to **edit your abstract** as long as you have not submitted it until the deadline.

## 5. Presentation format

If accepted, your abstract may be selected for:

- **Oral presentation**
- **Printed poster presentation**

---

## 6. After submission

- Abstracts will be **peer-reviewed**, and ranked for selection.
- Notification of acceptance/rejection will be sent a few weeks after the end of the submission.

---

## 7. Abstract book / publication

- Accepted abstracts will be published in an official **abstract book unless stated otherwise**.
